	Plan a rotation strategy to prevent soil depletion and disease
	Create a planting calendar for starting and transplanting seeds using zone 8B calendars you can find online
	Add compost and soil amendments to garden beds
	Use sheet mulching with cardboard and mulch to suppress weeds and improve soil quality
	Start seeds for cool-weather crops such as onions, leeks, broccoli, cabbage, and cauliflower.
	Check/organize seed-starting trays, grow lights, and other supplies
	Purchase or make fresh seed-starting mix for healthy seed germination
	Prune dormant fruit trees to remove dead wood and shape for air circulation
	Trim rose bushes to outward-facing buds, leaving three to five strong canes
	Divide and transplant hardy perennials if weather conditions are mild
	Check mulch levels around sensitive plants to maintain frost protection
	Clean and sharpen tools to extend their lifespan and improve efficiency
	Organize gardening supplies for easy access during planting season
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
